Said Ivory's telegram: "The huge stadium, containing nearly three thousand delegates and alternates, besides an audience of 17,000 seemed at times to quake as the enthusiasm of the crowd carried it away."

(Continued From Page One) "political reasons." The two divisional generals were replaced, before the Thursday attempt on Hitler's life, by "two juvenile political colonels, both under 33, who have a record of fanatical Nazi loyalty," the broadcast said.

Quarters Blocked Off

A dispatch, clearing through Berlin censorship to der bund at Bern, Switzerland, today said any effort at revolt could be considered to have collapsed.

Reach Sweden

Indicative of this, 12 German planes reached Stockholm by plane from Berlin today, but were put under close watch by two gestapo men attached to the German legation.

Slaughter Possibility

These were said to include Field Marshal Walter von Brauchitsch, Karl Gerd von Rundstedt, Sigmund Wilhelm List and Fritz Erich von Mannstein—none of whom has been heard from since Berlin announced two days ago that Adolf Hitler had narrowly escaped assassination.

Navy Revolt

Radio France in Algiers quoted reports from Basel that it was generally believed there that naval units at Kiel and Stettin had rebelled. The Brazzaville radio reported unrest among naval units in Norwegian ports and said an organization called "the Fraternal Association of All German Sailors" appeared to be behind the movement.
