All applications must be MAILED in to the War Price and Rationing Board at 430 Main Street, and NOT presented in person. SUGAR—Ration Book 4—Stamp number 1000 for 5 pounds previously announced to expire March 31 will continue to be good for an indefinite period. Ration Book 4—Stamp number 22 good for 3 pounds of sugar from June 15 for an indefinite period. Spare Stamp #7—Not the sugar stamp—must be included with applications for rationing sugar. Stamp number 40 good for 5 pounds of canned sugar. Stamp No. 31 valid for 3 pounds indefinitely beginning April 1. Ration Book 3—Stamp number 1 good for one pair shoes, valid indefinitely. Airplane stamp number 2 good to an unannounced date. PROCESSED FOODS—MEATS—Ration Book 4—Stamp number 1000 for 5 pounds previously announced to expire March 31 will continue to be good for an indefinite period. Stamp No. 18 through 18B valid June 4 through June 21. GASOLINE—Number 12 coupon valid from June 21 to September 21, good for three gallons. "B" or "C" Coupons—May be renewed within 15 days before 15 days from date of expiration. FUEL OIL—Period 4 coupons valid March 14 to September 30. FUEL OIL—Period 3 coupons valid March 26 to September 30. STOVES—Purchasers must obtain certificate from local board. SHOES—Book 3 airplane stamps 1 and 2 valid indefinitely.
