Stockmen Complain Of Point Renewal

PORTLAND, July 27 (AP)—Livestock men complained today that the renewal or ration points on choice lamb cuts had cut business and jammed the market with unsalable animals.

R. L. Clark, secretary of the Portland Livestock Exchange, said one wholesaler who was handling 200 lambs a week is no longer handling any.

Orville Buckman, regional OPA food rationing official, arrived here to confer with local OPA representatives on the situation.
