

FEWER CARS NOTED ON TAX STAMP ROLLS

 WASHINGTON, July 27 (AP)—The \$5 annual automobile use tax was paid on nearly 2,400,000 fewer cars in the fiscal year ended June 30 than in the preceding 12 months.

This is among the facts revealed today in the internal revenue bureau's annual breakdown on who paid what to produce record-breaking \$40,121,760,232 internal revenue receipts.

The \$5 automobile use tax produced \$134,325,537, a decline of \$11,963,746.

This meant that nearly 2,400,000 motorists either had (1) junked their cars, (2) put them up for the duration, or (3) decided to risk the \$25 penalty provided for not having the use sticker.

Gasoline taxes also reflected rationing and tire shortages. This tax brought in \$271,216,501, a decline of \$17,569,324.

Income and excess profits taxes provided more than three-fourths of the total revenue.

Corporation income taxes accounted for \$5,284,145,852, an increase of \$763,294,142; individual income taxes (exclusive of withholding), \$10,437,570,433; up \$4,493,653,454; withholding, \$7,823,434,977, up \$7,137,419,966.

Excess profits taxes amounted to \$9,345,198,293 an increase of \$4,281,334,679.

Liquor taxes totaled \$1,618,775,155, an increase of \$195,128,689.

Tobacco taxes brought in \$988,483,236, up \$64,625,953. Snuff, usually thought of as out of date, accounted for \$7,692,236 of the tobacco total.

Employment taxes jumped \$239,667,402—from \$1,498,705,033 to \$1,738,372,435.

Some of the miscellaneous taxes: Transportation (seats and berths), \$153,682,607, up \$66,550,873; bowling alleys and pool tables, \$2,208,422 up \$355,757.

Increase Expected In OSC Freshmen

CORVALLIS, July 27 (AP)—Applications received from prospective new students indicate a light increase in entering freshmen this fall, Oregon State college officials said today.

While early reports are not always a reliable indication, these now show a 10 per cent upturn in applications approved for fall term entrance. College officials predicted last spring that the low point in wartime enrollment had been reached, although they did not expect much change in the total for the fall term of 1944 compared with that of a year ago.

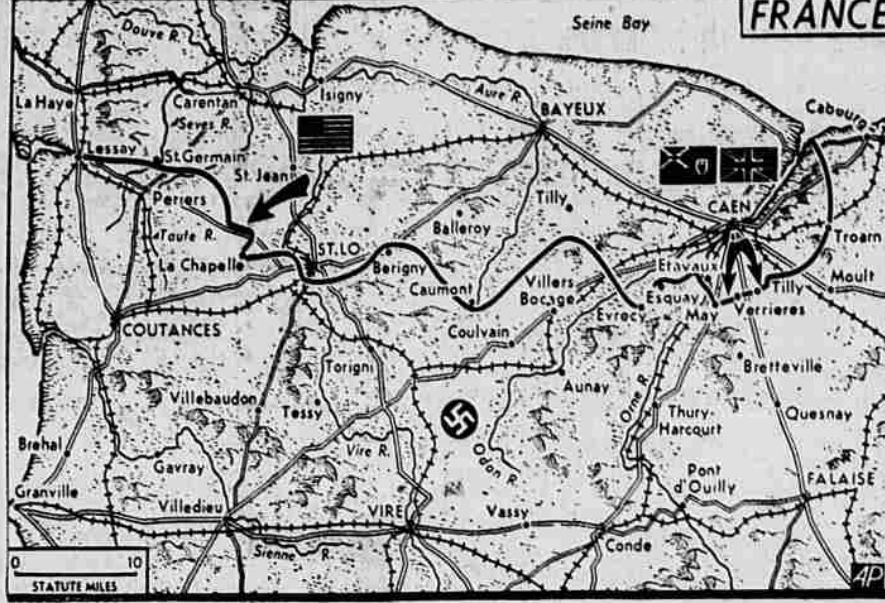

NEW WEAPON MAY NOT BE PROPAGANDA

ADVANCE COMMAND POST ALLIED EXPEDITIONARY FORCE, July 27 (AP)—An allied commentator said today that German talk of using 10-ton explosive rockets against England, in the manner of the robot bombs, may not be sheer propaganda talk.

He pointed to attacks by RAF Lancasters on possible V-2 (rocket) sites with 12,000 pound "quake-makers."

A new rocket is reported from certain unauthenticated sources inside France to weigh about 90 tons at launching. Its size is said to diminish as fuel is expended in flight through the stratosphere and the 10-ton warhead is designed as the part of this monster weapon to reach its destination.

The commentator said V-2 might be highly inaccurate or might fizzle out in flight, but that there should be no wishful thinking.

The Germans call their present robot bombs, bombarding London and southern England, the V-1.

FRENCH CARRY ON WARFARE AGAINST NAZIS

SUPREME HEADQUARTERS ALLIED EXPEDITIONARY FORCE, July 27 (AP)—French patriots have defeated German tank attacks in ambushes and are continuing successful warfare against the foe, the supreme command said today in a communique from an advanced command post.
