

DEMOS ASK SESSION TO AMEND VOTE LAW

PORTLAND, Aug. 3 (P) — Democratic party workers circulated petitions today asking Governor Snell to call a legislative session to amend the absentee voters' law to assure servicemen voting opportunity.

Lew Wallace, democratic national committee man from Oregon, disclosed also that Portland's Elks lodge adopted a resolution urging the governor to "immediately call a special session to enact legislation to change the independent filing date from September 23 to August 15 to give soldiers additional time to return November ballots."

The resolution asserted that some 300 ballots from soldiers from Multnomah county were returned too late in the May 19 primary.
