New Seeding Plan Set For China

PORTLAND, Aug. 5 (AP)—Seeds imbedded in clay pellets will be scattered from airplanes over China's eroded hills after the war to increase that country's food production.

It's part of a plan worked out there last year by Dr. Walter C. Lowdermilk, assistant chief of the U. S. soil conservation service, on a trip sponsored by Generalissimo Chiang Kai-Shek.

Dr. Lowdermilk told an interviewer his program also calls for thousands of small dams to control water run-off and store it for irrigation.

Winter Victory Gardens Urged

PORTLAND, Ore., Aug. 5 (AP)—Growing of winter victory gardens in northwest coast cities was urged today by Norvell Gillespie, western director of the National Victory Garden institute.

Spinach, kale, lettuce, carrots, beets, cauliflower, rutabagas, endive, brussels sprouts, Chinese and savoy cabbage and collards—a cabbage substitute in the deep south—will do well if planted promptly, he said.

Gillespie warned that the armed forces' requirements of 86,000,000 cases of vegetables this year will reduce by one-fifth the commercial pack available for civilians.

100 ATTEND FIELD DAY AT STATION

Nearly 100 farmers from all parts of Klamath basin attended the annual field day held at the experiment station west of the naval air base Friday afternoon.

Henry Semon, member of the executive state advisory committee, explained the purpose of the station, pointing out the necessity of improving poor lands in order that they might be returned on the tax roll for the maintenance of an adequate county tax base.

Semon stated that an expansion of the station was underway to include work on peat soils, a type of soil of which Klamath basin has an acreage exceeding 100,000. Information on the handling of these lands for best production is not yet complete.

Work is being undertaken on the best lands of Klamath basin as well, Semon continued, in order to further increase the already rapidly growing agricultural production of this area.

After a few brief remarks by A. E. Gross, station superintendent, on work now in progress at the station, a complete tour of the station was made.

Outstanding among the accomplishments of the station pointed out by Gross was the reclamation of class five lands, (lands excluded from tax roll as unable to pay taxes) to the point where they are now producing good average crops of potatoes, alfalfa, grain and seed crops.

Of particular interest were small areas of carrots and onions carried over from last year with indications of an excellent seed crop this season.

One of the most important demonstrations to the group present was that of the production of fall-seeded grain, particularly winter barley. Of several varieties of barley seeded October 1, Utah or White Winter barley made the best showing. It is now ready for harvest with prospects of an excellent yield. This will provide ample time for seeding clover in the stubble early enough to secure a good stand with a minimum of winter killing.

The group were shown many other important crops such as different varieties of alfalfa, seeded with selected grasses, spring-seeded grain variety trials, special creeping alfalfa, Kok-saghyz or Russian dandelion, lotus and other crops.
