

ATTEMPT MADE TO SEPARATE ALLIED LINES

ready was mocked by the American run around their dangling southern flank.

Supported by a close allied naval blockade which already had broken up three German convoys apparently attempting a "little Dunkerque" from Brittany, American armor and infantry teams captured four more towns in the Breton peninsula in the closing stages of an offensive which promised to clinch control soon of the ports of Brest, St. Nazaire, Nantes, Lorient and St. Malo.

St. Malo, an ancient sea fortress and fishing port on Brittany's north coast, was under attack by strong forces, which broke through the outer perimeter of landward defenses at Chateaufort. In spite of the order of the commander to fight until the last man, 500 of a garrison estimated at 2000 to 3000 men, surrendered under a bombardment of shells, bombs and leaflets carrying an ultimatum to lay down their arms.

Bonneville Takes Over Construction

PORTLAND, Ore., Aug. 7 (P) The Bonneville power administration will take over from a contractor work on the half-finished second 230,000-volt transmission line from Grand Coulee dam to near Rick island on the Columbia river.

The agency announced that it would finish the construction because of inability of Enterprise Electric company of Baltimore, Md., to complete its contract and the loss in time that would be entailed in obtaining another contractor.

Equipment and crews of the Maryland concern will be retained to push the 72-mile eastern section of the 183-mile line to Covington near Seattle, the statement said.

One light cruiser, five smaller vessels.

Damaged—Two escort vessels, a large freighter hit on both days, three landing ships and 18 small vessels, including five barges, two of them troop-laden.

Six Planes Hit

At Iwo, six enemy planes were shot down. Six others were destroyed, and five damaged, on the ground. One parked plane was destroyed at Chichi. Island anti-aircraft guns shot down 16 American carrier planes, and 19 American fighters were lost.

The Bonin-Kazan islands are less than 800 miles north of Saipan, most advanced American base in the Marianas, where airstrips are under construction.

Strongly indicating that B-29 Superfortresses will be based on Saipan, Brig. Gen. Robert W. Douglass Jr., commander of the

seventh army air base, disclosed that American engineers in the Marianas, "accomplishing a miracle of construction," were building big air bases "that threaten the very gates of Tok." Forced deeper.

On Guam, 130 miles south of Saipan, American soldiers and marines forced Japanese defenders deeper into the northern quarter of the island. Advancing one to three miles in two days, the Americans captured two more villages, Ukudu and Leguan, five miles northeast of the American-occupied capital, Agaña.

Marines began operating fighter planes off the Orote peninsula airstrip on Guam, cleared of the wreckage of 76 Japanese planes. Guam's civilians continued to surrender by the hundreds; 22,000 already have taken refuge behind American lines.

American sixth army troops who landed at Sansapor, Dutch New Guinea, 600 miles southeast of the Philippines, last week, have cut enemy coastal communications and driven the Japanese back into the jungle "in a state bordering on demoralization."

essential if Britain is to play her full part in the Pacific war, the National Association of Manufacturers reported today.

"British officials have told our leaders that such action is absolutely necessary to stave off a serious economic situation in England," the NAM News, weekly publication of the association said.

"It is claimed that unless we do bolster Britain's domestic economy, she will not be able to play the part expected of her in the Pacific war."

The publication said the proposal, now under discussion in high administration circles, would cost the United States \$2,500,000,000 and up annually above war costs, and would be a wide departure from the present lend-lease program because

Intense Pressure

Russian pressure was fiercely intense against all German strong-points. Steadily encroaching, the red army neared the moment when it could launch powerful blows toward the Danube basin which is Germany's bread basket.

Warsaw, under siege for more than a week, seethed with street fighting between Poles and the German garrison. Fires still burned in the city from German demolitions. Marshal Konstantin Rokossovsky presumably was continuing to probe with Russian and Polish infantry for crossing of the broad and swift Vistula which would outflank the Polish capital from north and south.

WFA Gives Support Prices for Fruit

WASHINGTON, Aug. 7 (AP) Support prices for canned apples, peaches, pears, fruit mix, and fruit mix, packed since 1944, were announced today by the War Food Administration.
