A few gendarme agents and soldiers to cover the French frontier.

German police at the Hemlock bridge maintained that the situation was a "purely temporary withdrawal," necessitated by reassignment of border forces following the shift in SS (elite guards) units to the frontier garrison toward the Loire river.

Frenchmen living on the Spanish side of the frontier said, however, they are convinced the high command is abandoning southwestern France, and they believe they will awake one morning soon and find the German gone.

Regular German army forces moved out of the region south of Bayonne over a week ago, and the SS units behind. The forces in turn began leaving early night.

Only French customs guards and two or three German gendarmes were on duty at the International bridge across the Bidasoa river here yesterday.

PORTLAND, Aug. 8 (AP)—Sailors must wait until after 5 p. m. to make purchases at Oregon liquor stores despite lifting of restrictions by 13th naval district headquarters in Seattle.

The Oregon liquor control commission will decide Monday whether to change its regulation barring sales to navy personnel before that hour, Administrator Ray Conway announced.

The army still prohibits sale of liquor to soldiers before 5 p. m.
