PORTLAND, Ore., Aug. 9 (AP)—A 30-hour week was proposed today at the AFL machinists' convention as the solution to post-war jobs for everyone.

The resolution, introduced by Roy Brown, vice president, Los Angeles, calls for two daily shifts of six hours each, with men working five days a week. Spokesmen for the 200 dele-

gates from Oregon, Washington, and California declared that men could produce more per hour by working shorter periods.
