HOLLYWOOD, Aug. 15 (AP)—A marital rift has occurred in the home of Cary Grant and his beauteous wife, Barbara Hutton. Grant, and as a result, the actor left home for two days, Perry Lieber, a representative of the RKO studio said today.

Lieber first announced that the couple had separated but later added that he understood that Grant returned home last night.

"The trouble still has not been patched up," Lieber asserted. "So far as I know they are in

the same house, but the house is so big they could both be there and still be separated."
