182 ATTEND VOCATIONAL CLASSES HERE

One hundred and eighty-two marines from the Marine Barracks are taking part in the vocational education classes at KUHS under the directorship of L. L. Erdmann.

Training facilities are used for military personnel when not needed for war production training. Marines who wish to enter the classes must be recommended by the commanding officer and must be approved by the navy department and the U. S. office of education in Washington D. C.

The program is financed through the state department of vocational education at Salem, Ore., and the local school unit. All courses set up are for a period of 13 weeks or 195 hours, with the boys choosing the course they want.

Erdmann said the classes are justified in service value, in recuperation value, and in post-war training.

The teachers and their classes with the number of marines attending are as follows: A. E. Harris, machine shop, 30 in the class; Harold Palmer, typing, 40 in the class; L. C. Shook, welding, 32 in the class; Harold Van Hoosen, aviation and general sheet metal, 40 in the class; George Conner, radio repair, 40 in the class.

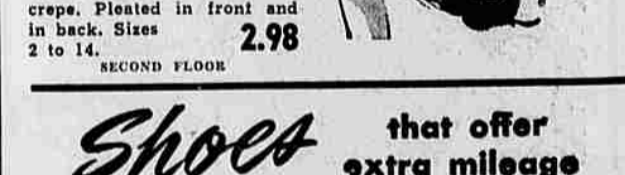
