## HERE'S HOW TO MAKE MARVELOUS PEAR JAM

Save Sugar and Fruit with This Quick, Easy Recipe

3 1/4 Cups Ground Pears  
4 1/2 Cups Sugar  
1/2 Cup Lemon Juice  
1 Package M.C.P. Pectin

Wash, peel, and core 2 1/2 pounds fully ripe pears; grind fruit. Measure exactly 3 1/4 level cups of the ground pears (add water to fill last cup, if necessary) into a large kettle. Add the M.C.P. Pectin and lemon juice, stir well and bring to a boil, stirring constantly. NOW, add the sugar (which has been previously measured), continue stirring, and bring to a full rolling boil. BOIL EXACTLY 4 MINUTES. Remove from fire, let the boil subside, stir and skim by turns for 5 minutes. Pour into sterilized jars, allowing 1/2-inch space for sealing with fresh paraffin.

## THOMAS TO ENTER PRESIDENTIAL RACE

A nominating convention to place the names of Norman Thomas, socialist candidate for president, and Darlington Hoopes, socialist candidate for vice president, on the Oregon ballot at the November election will be held in Portland August 30 at the Washington high school auditorium. This will be the only public appearance of Thomas in Portland during the coming campaign. He will, however, meet with a number of groups during the day preceding the convention. In order to nominate the Thomas-Hoopes ticket the conven-

tion must be attended by 250 qualified electors. Any registered voter in the state is eligible to participate in it. The candidates will be listed on the ballot as independent candidates if a record of the convention proceedings, together with the names of the candidates and the names and addresses of 250 or more qualified electors participating in the convention are duly filed with the secretary of state not later than 45 days before the November election.

Arrangements for the convention are being worked out by a committee under the leadership of R. D. Snyder, 7314 SE 14th avenue, Portland.

## DEWEY SCHEDULES SPEECH ON COAST

PORTLAND, Aug. 24 (AP)—Two or three major addresses will be made by Gov. Thomas E. Dewey on the Pacific coast soon, and Gov. John W. Bricker of Ohio, his running mate on the republican presidential slate, will campaign in this area later, according to a republican official.
