

WINNING SHOW PLATED FOR 4-H CLUBBERS

In conjunction with the 4-H garden show, the third 4-H canning show will be held at the Alton Junior high school, August 26. At this occasion, the honor of being the first 4-H club girl to be crowned queen will be bestowed on the 4-H club girl enrolled in the canning project.

To determine who will receive the honor as queen, Mrs. Winnie K. Gillen, home demonstration agent, will make a tour of the county, visiting the clubs, and will score the canned goods, vegetables, meats, relishes, and fowl, as the club members have them at home. Their exhibits will also be judged at the show by Mrs. Gillen. A point system will be used, and the girl with the most points, with the best canned goods, both at home and at the show, will reign as queen.

Four divisions are open in the canning contest, as follows: Division 1: Two jars of fruit, two varieties. Division 2: Three containers of fruit, three varieties. Division 3: One jar of fruit, one jar of vegetables, three relishes, two varieties. Division 4: Two jars of fruit, two varieties; two jars of meat, fish, or fowl, two varieties; one container of pickles or relishes.

PORTLAND, Ore., Aug. 24 (P)—Purchase of the Tidewater Transportation company by the Shaver Forwarding company, was announced today by Capt. Homer T. Shaver, president.

The purchase joins the two oldest operators of tugs and barges on the Upper Columbia river. The consolidated company will ply from the river mouth to Pasco and Kennewick, Wash.

Postwar extension plans call for operations as far up the Columbia and Snake rivers as practicable, Capt. Shaver said, including services to Hanford, Wash., and Lewiston, Idaho.

DDT CONTROLS LEAF ROLLER ON BERRIES

CORVALLIS, Aug. 24 (P)—Complete control of the oblique banded leaf roller that ruined much of the Gresham berry crop last year was obtained this season by the use of the new wonder insecticide DDT, Oregon State college entomologists said today.

As far as known, this is the first crop of commercial size on which the new insecticide has been used, as all supplies except experimental quantities have been reserved for the armed forces. Because of the impending certain loss of the crop on hundreds of acres of the raspberries destined for military use,

federal officials last spring released 100 pounds of DDT for 250 seriously infested acres.

The DDT was applied in mid-May, after the berries were in bloom. The field results proved as complete as previous laboratory trials had indicated, so that more than 99 per cent control was obtained and the crop saved. Careful observations failed to reveal any damage to honey bees working the raspberry blooms.
