Speedy End to War Depends On People, Asserts Atherton

SPOKANE, Aug. 25 (AP)—A speedy end to the war, in the opinion of Warren Atherton, national commander of the American Legion, depends upon whether the nation could "remember country and forget politics long enough to keep supplying our troops at the present rate."

Speaking before a group of Spokane Legionnaires, Atherton predicted: "Germany may collapse within the next few weeks and defeat of the Japanese probably will take less than a year after that."
