

BUSES SLATED FOR FRESHMAN DAY AT KUHS

Four school buses will be available to bring entering freshmen who live outside the city limits to the high school Thursday, August 31, for freshman day, according to Principal Stanley Woodruff.

One bus will leave the high school at 12:15 and start picking up students at Wocus Flat about 12:30. This bus will return through Pelican City and Shipington and go north on Lakeshore Drive to Geary's ranch.

Another bus will leave the high school at 12:45 and will go to the Weyerhaeuser junction, Weyerhaeuser hotel, and return.

The third bus will leave the high school at 12:30 and go out Summers lane to the Anderson road and thence to Altamont Drive, South Sixth and back to the high school via South Sixth street.

A fourth bus will leave at 12:30 and go out Shasta Way to Ward street and then to South Sixth and return to the high school via South Sixth.

The buses will make their return trips about 3:30.

The program is scheduled to start at 1:30 p. m., August 31, in the auditorium. Although primarily for entering freshmen, it should be of interest and value to all new students.

Bob McLean, student body president, and several other student leaders are expected to participate. The object of the meeting is to acquaint new students with the traditions, customs, and regulations of Klamath Union high school as well as the physical plant. Attendance is voluntary but it is hoped all newcomers will attend.

Third Day of Pounding Hits German Oil Targets

LONDON, Aug. 26 (AP)—Targets today included the Scholvan-Buer and Nordstern synthetic oil plants at Geisenkerchen, an oil refinery at Emmerich near the Dutch border, an oil finishing plant at Salzbogen west of Osnabruck, and synthetic oil facilities at Ludwigshafen near the Swiss border.

German batteries and fortified positions at Brest were attacked by up to 250 Liberators and Flying Fortresses, aiding ground assaults to crush resistance in the big Atlantic port. Brest's defenses were drenched last night by 1350 tons of explosives by the RAF.

BIDS ON PROJECTS SLATED FOR MEET

SALEM, Aug. 26 (AP)—Bids for six projects totaling approximately \$150,000 have been called for the next meeting of the state highway commission, to be held Monday, September 11, at the Imperial hotel, Portland.

The projects:

Paint exterior of division office building, storage and shop buildings at Milwaukee division headquarters, Portland.

Repair timber truss spans over Nehalem river on Fishhawk Falls secondary highway, 51 miles south of Jewell in Clatsop county.

Construction of timber log bridge on concrete piers over the creek on Roseburg access road project in city of Roseburg. Part of federal project.

Grading and paving Roseburg access road project on Pacific highway and North Umpqua county road. Part of federal project.

Approximately 12,600 cubic yards of crushed gravel in stockpiles for Nimrod-Alder springs rock production project on McKenzie highway.

Replace existing timber bridge with 48-inch concrete pipe on Nehalem avenue in city of Rockaway.

American air task forces today to drop their bombs visually.

In another concentrated attack before dawn the RAF dumped nearly 1700 tons of bombs on the Opel Motor Works at Russelsheim between Mainz and Frankfurt.

Others smacked flying bomb launching sites and a rocket depot in northern France, the rail and industrial town of Darmstadt in the upper Rhineland, and Mosquitos unloaded two-ton blockbusters on Berlin. The RAF lost 27 planes during the night.

The allied air forces lost 78 planes in their extensive operations yesterday and throughout the night. These included 17 bombers, seven fighters for the U. S. eighth air force and 19 planes for the U. S. ninth air force.

Against their losses the allies tallied 144 German aircraft destroyed in the air and on the ground.
