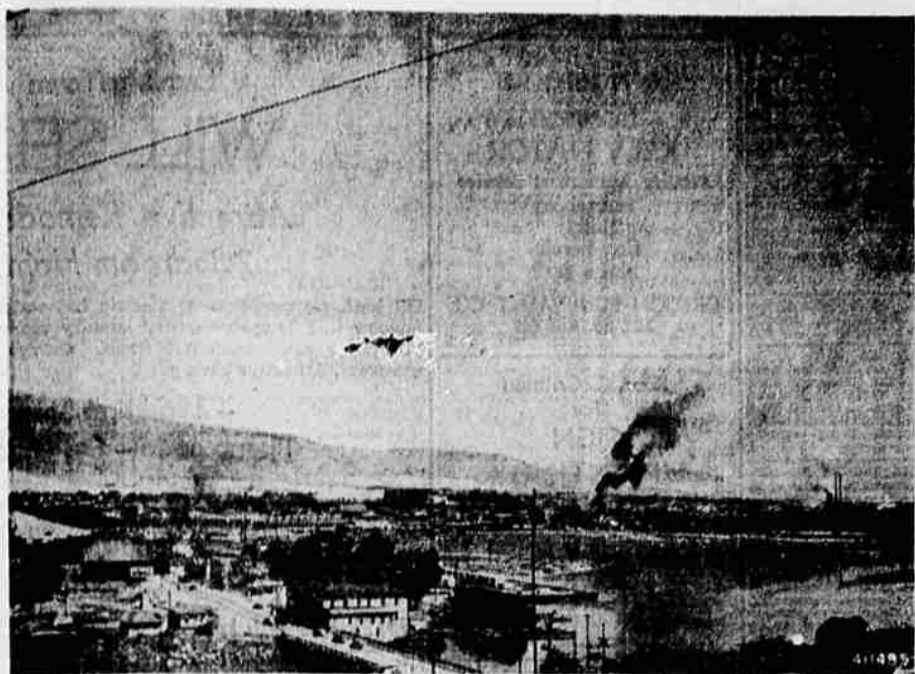


# KEEP KLAMATH GREEN
