FIRE PROTECTION

It costs from 3 to 5 cents per acre per year to protect timber land from forest fires.

The Tillamook fire of August 14, 1933, destroyed 300,000 acres of timber valued at 20 million dollars. On the night of September 26, the city of Bandon, Oregon, was burnt out by a forest fire, killing nine persons and destroying property valued at one and one-half million dollars.

TIMBER RESOURCES

Klamath Basin has 3,500,000,000 board feet of merchantable timber. It has close to 3,000,000 of forest type land including young growth and woodlands.



The Trees Are Down and Cut Into Logs, Next Stop—the Mill


Forests are work reservoirs. It requires an average of 8 men working one year to manufacture one million board feet of lumber. The remanufacture of this lumber will require an additional 8 to 20 men. If serious fires are allowed to start, Klamath county could lose from 68,000 to 170,000 man years of employment.
