# PLANE KNOCKS OUT NIP SHIP, BUILDING

ALEUTIAN HEADQUARTERS, 11TH AIR FORCE, Sept. 1 (Delayed) (AP)—One small Japanese vessel was sunk so close to shore today that a dock building flew apart with it under blasting from bombs of a raiding army plane at Kapani Saki on Paramushiro island.

The B-25 Mitchell, piloted by Lt. Donald William Hoffarth of Jackson, Mich., flew clear across the North Pacific to the Sea of Okhotsk to strike at the southwestern tip of Paramushiro. It was the deepest penetration made thus far into the Kuriles by a plane of the "New Broom" squadron which has been attacking and sinking enemy vessels in the North Pacific since last May.

Lt. Hoffarth brought his medium bomber down to deck level and dropped three bombs to send the boat and building sky high. The plane was so close Japanese could easily be seen standing in
