

# DEWEY FAVORS ACTION NOW ON SECURITY

 EN ROUTE WITH DEWEY, Sept. 9 (AP)—Gov. Thomas E. Dewey turned northward to his native state of Michigan to start 10 days of grass root campaigning today after declaring at Louisville, Ky., last night for the formation of a force-wielding world security organization without waiting for the war's end.

The republican presidential nominee traveled toward Lansing, without any scheduled stops, for conferences with Gov. Harry F. Kelly and leaders of political, farm, labor, negro and other organizations.

Aides insisted this was part and parcel of his determination to avoid any appearance of a typical peacetime "barnstorming" tour. Until September 18, when he speaks at Seattle, he will make only brief train-stops, appearances and spend most of his time in conferences.

Dewey made it plain before he left Louisville, however, that he is ready to take issue with anyone whose views do not coincide with his.

He called "a little naive" a written question submitted by Warren Moscow, reporter for the New York Times, inquiring if the nominee agreed with Senator Arthur Vandenberg (R-Mich.) that an international peace organization "should not be established until after the peace settlement."

"Well, Warren, the question is a little naive," Dewey said with a smile at the reporters gathered around him in the Roof Garden ballroom of a downtown Louisville hotel.

"The international organization that we will achieve at the end of this war will only be commenced after 60 nations have been brought together and have agreed on the structure," the nominee continued. "Now, if we work at top speed with all of the finest skill and talent that we have at our command, and at the command of all the other nations, it will take months to develop complete agreement upon all of the aspects of the international organization."

The war pace was so swift, Dewey went on, that none could tell when it might end and the nearer we are to being in agreement on its form, the nearer we will be to the point where it can begin effective work.

"I feel very strongly that work on it, negotiations on it, consultations and the bringing in of the small nations should all proceed as rapidly as possible," he said.

# Savage Battle For Rimini Takes Heavy Toll of Casualties

storms hampered allied attempts to press the attack, but the tempo of the fighting was not reduced.

**Fight to Marano**  
 Along the coast, where the Canadians fought to the banks of the Marano river, within four miles of Rimini's outskirts two days ago, the allied command reported only that patrols were maintaining contact with the enemy. A heavy curtain of mortar and artillery fire was being laid down in the path of the Canadians' advance.

Palazzo and the neighboring hill 151, six miles inland, was seized by the British, who beat off determined tank counter-attacks.

**Village Retained**  
 The village of Menghio, 1000 yards west of Croce and the same distance south of hill 151, was also retained by the British in the face of desperate Nazi lunges to regain lost ground. Two miles farther inland the battle raged in the town of Gemmano for the third day with unabated fury. The Germans still hold the western half of the town.

Pushing against rearwards should the Nazi withdrawal into Gothic line positions in the northern Apennines, allied troops seized the 3000-foot Mount Morello, eight miles north of Florence.

# M'Cartney Pleads Guilty to Charge

Gordon McCartney this week pleaded guilty in justice court to a charge of petit larceny involving the theft of an outboard motor belonging to W. J. Kessler. He was fined \$50, plus \$12.40 costs.

which was not parried anywhere by Japanese planes, pulled out of the area to bases further north.

The Santa Anna seaplane base was wrecked. Hangars, repair shops and trucks were smashed at Buayan airdrome. Four 1000-ton freighters and five barges were sunk at Sarangani bay. A Japanese transport plane was shot down.

# Open Attack

At Pearl Harbor, Adm. Chester W. Nimitz disclosed that on September 5, the day fighter planes from aircraft carriers monopolized the skies over Palau, carrier planes opened three days of attacks with 110 tons of bombs and numerous rockets on Yap and Ulithi. The raiders wiped out a radio cable station, anti-aircraft positions, storage dumps and building at a cost of three pilots and one air crew man.

Axis reports described the action as of large scale. Berlin radio quoted Tokyo advices that 400 to 500 planes pounded Palau on two days, with 300 others sent against Yap. Such mammoth air blows frequently presage landing operations but the reports were not confirmed.

# Payments to Lower State's Bonded Debt

SALEM, Sept. 9 (AP)—State Treasurer Leslie M. Scott said today that on October 1 he would pay off \$2,073,225 in state bonds, reducing the state's bonded debt to \$20,553,290.

The debt in 1928 reached a peak of \$68,082,810. The net general debt, however, now is only \$5,000,000, because the state has \$15,000,000 in investments which will be used to pay off bonds when they expire.

The total debt now includes \$12,675,000 in veterans' bonds, \$8,500,000 in highway bonds, \$1,372,290 in irrigation bonds, and \$1,378,500 in higher education bonds.
