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LUMBER SHIPMENT
DECREASE NOTED

A slight decrease in lumber shipments is noted by Southern Pacific here, which may be attributed to the labor shortage in all branches of the lumber industry, as well as the shutting down of logging operations now completed in some sections of the Klamath area.

Potato shipments are increasing daily, with over 100 carloads already moved out this season.

WLB Denies Demands
For Wage Increase

PORTLAND, Sept. 9 (P)—The WLB's west coast lumber commission has denied demands of approximately 3100 CIO International Woodworkers of America members in the Eugene and Reedsport areas for a general wage increase, two weeks' vacation after two years, union hiring and compulsory state compensation insurance.

But granted in the decision announced late yesterday were a new rate of \$1.75 an hour for power saw operators, a voluntary checkoff of dues, a contract clause providing that certain subcontractors must comply with the union working agreement, and a provision concerning hours of labor.

IN 35TH POSITION

According to Godfrey C. Blohm, manager of the local branch, recent figures released by the American Banker place the United States National bank in 35th position in size among the nation's top ranking banks.

ROAD EXTENSION
CONTRACT AWARDED

Contract for extension of the Horseglades road in the Bly area has been let to Baker and Graves Construction company and work on the road, all of which is to be financed by the

Bureau of Public Roads, began this week, it was announced by the county court Friday.

The construction job will lengthen Horseglades road six miles or as far as Sycan. When completed it will be a good access road to the Pelican Bay Lumber camp, enabling later fall and earlier spring logging operations by that company.

County Judge U. E. Reeder said that it is expected that the six-mile extension stretch will be completed in about three

weeks. A new road bed is being cut as was done in the earlier construction of the rest of the Horseglades road. Cinders are being used for surfacing.
