

# RECORD SET AT LAKEVIEW AUCTION SALE

LAKEVIEW — Setting a record for the four years of the Lakeview livestock auction sale, a record that may not be equaled anywhere in the county, was the Lakeview Livestock Auction sale held Monday at the Lake county fair. The sale totalled \$12,734.70. The total includes \$709.83 in sales for the benefits of the Cross, 4-H club leaders' and Extension Service Men's Center, Boy Scouts and Girl Scouts. Highest price paid per pound was for a 4-H steer, which sold for \$143.38. Highest price paid for baby pig was that for Kathryn Joy Bly's fifth place 4-H steer which brought 95 cents a pound. Buzard Burkhardt Pine Lumber company for a total of \$8.80. Earl William's grand champion 4-H steer and Bobby Howard's reserve champion 4-H steer each brought 81 cents a pound, while several others brought 80 cents. Lowest price paid for baby beef was 55 cents a pound. Highest price paid for lambs was the \$1.50 Buzard-Burkhardt Lumber company paid per pound for Dorothy Withers' champion 4-H lamb. Best hog price paid was 50 cents a pound from H. R. Crane of Bly for Billy Odegaard's sixth place 4-H junior fat hog. Winners in the FFA division of the fair were Bill Pratt, who topped the baby beef title and Polinder, who won the title of the special scholarship award which will be a trip to the state FFA convention. Both are from Lakeview.

# ROAD SYSTEM ENVISIONED BY SPONSORS

By ERNEST B. VACCARO WASHINGTON, Sept. 11 (P)—A high speed postwar highway system adequate to serve an estimated 40,000,000 motor vehicles was envisioned today by sponsors of road construction legislation ready for senate consideration this week.

Despising of an immediate agreement by joint conference committees seeking to work out senate and house differences over reconversion and surplus property disposal bills, party leaders summoned absent senators back to consider other major legislation. Senator Hayde (D-Ariz.) said he would move to take up a pending \$3,375,250,000 road construction proposal tomorrow if there is a large attendance, and, if not then, "the first time I sight enough members on the floor to give it proper consideration."

## Prune Ceiling Prices Set

WASHINGTON, Sept. 11 (P)—Producers' ceiling prices for dried prunes in Washington and Oregon, effective immediately, are \$200 a ton for the 80-cent variety, the office of price administration announced.

## Milk Ceilings Set

WASHINGTON, Sept. 11 (P)—Dollar and cent price ceilings at the same general level as "freeze" prices already in effect, have been placed on skim milk, buttermilk, whey and whey solubles by the office of price administration. The ceilings are effective September 14.
