SALEM, Sept. 14 (AP)—The number of seasonal employers registered under the state unemployment compensation law has

dropped to 150, compared with 186 a year ago and 825 in 1941, the unemployment commission said today.

Most seasonal employers are canneries, with seed cleaners and warehousing not far behind. The drop in the number of sea-

sonal industries is due to the fact that many of them now operate throughout the year.

Marion county leads with 23 seasonal industries, followed by Clatsop's 21 and Multnomah's 16.
