

BOMBER TRAIN HEADS TOWARD NAZI TARGETS

LONDON, Sept. 14 (AP)—A long procession of heavy bombers headed out across the North sea toward Germany in improving weather early tonight after clouds and squalls had limited reported air blows in the west to a 50-minute bombardment of Brest by medium and dive bombers during the afternoon.

Last night RAF Mosquitos blasted Berlin with two-ton blockbusters for the fourth night in a row, rounding out a 24-hour cycle in which more than 12,000 tons of high explosives were dropped on Germany in four massive bomber assaults.

The weather limited the bag by Mosquitos last night to one barge and one train in an attack on communications. Two planes were lost in the raid on Berlin, the 31st since allied troops landed on the continent, June 6.

Late reports from supplementary operations of American and British fighters and fighter-bombers showed good results against German frontline gun placements and communications.

RAF tactical units, working mainly in support of British, Canadian and Poles and the north, claimed five tugs, 12 barges, two medium-sized vessels, two armored launches and several locomotives.

Pilots reported no concentrations of either transport or troops, but what movement was sighted appeared to be headed generally east toward Germany.

The U. S. ninth air force flew 500 sorties, devoting its attention to enemy positions between Aachen and Koblenz on Lt. Gen. Courtney H. Hodges' first army front, and around Nancy and Metz on Lt. Gen. George S. Patton's third army sector.

The ninth got 11 German planes on the ground, 32 railway cars, "several" locomotives, 80 motor vehicles, and 21 pieces of armor, and shot up four forts, three gun positions, a flak tower, radio station and an air field, it was announced.

Seven planes were missing from the operations.

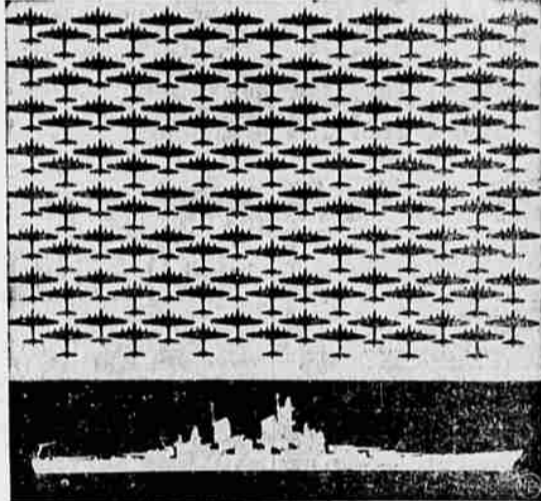

BAR, NATION FAIL IN DUTY, SAYS GATCH

CHICAGO, Sept. 14 (AP)—Rear Admiral Thomas L. Gatch, judge advocate general of the navy, told the American Bar association today that in the last two decades the American bar and the nation in general "failed to do its duty" and that the present war thus became inevitable.

"The tragic history of the decades between World War One and Two furnishes a clear and unmistakable series of guide posts along the road we must not follow again," he said in an address before the ABA's annual convention.

"As a result of the Washington limitation of armament treaty of 1922 we scrapped seven new battleships, four battle cruisers, and many other vessels then in process of construction—ships that would have saved many American lives in the present war, if they would not actually have prevented the Japanese attack on this country."

Admiral Gatch said he believed that with adequate armament in 1940 and 1941 "we would merely have had to say 'Boo' to Hitler to send him slinking to his kennel with his tail
