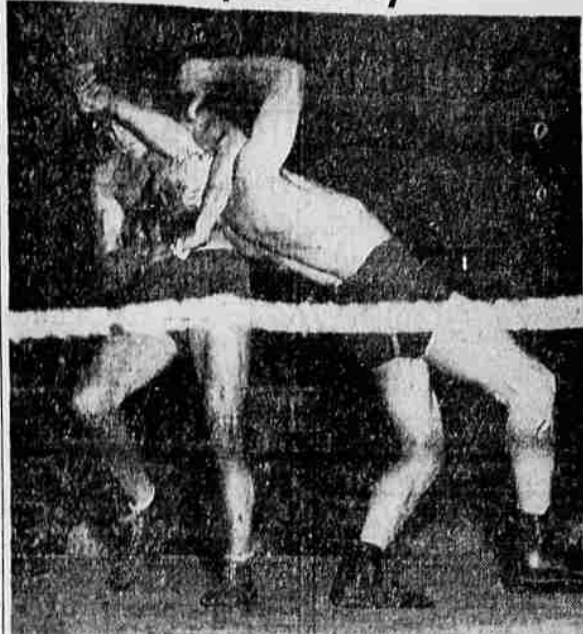

# Beavers Cut Down Oaks 5-0

### Portland Clings to Second Place As Pieretti Pitches Three-Hitter For 26th Win

Five hits, two walks and a hit batsman in the ninth inning gave the San Francisco Seals a 7 to 3 win over San Diego last night and kept the Seals in the running for the Coast Baseball league's second position.

The Padres led, 3-0, as Frank Dasso limited the Seals to five hits and no runs until one man was out in the ninth when Joe Sprinz singled to begin the parade of blows that won the game.

Portland's Beavers held their one-game second place lead as Marino Pieretti stopped Oakland's drive for an upper division berth with a three-hit, 5 to 0, shutout. It was the Beavers' first win of the week.

Pieretti's bat work accounted for three of Portland's 13 hits and drove in two runs. It was his 26th pitching win of the season, top number in the league. Los Angeles nosed out Seattle, 2 to 1, in a light pitching duel between Ray Prim and Johnny Babich. Prim allowed Seattle four hits while the Angels got three off Babich. The margin of victory went to Los Angeles when First Baseman Al Libke dropped Babich's bounce, letting Stan Gray score from second after two were out in the ninth.

There is a correction on Wednesday's deer story. Siskiyou county is divided into two districts, set by the California game commission, by the Dorris-Weed state highway.

On the west side of the highway two deer may be killed, two points or better, while on the east side and Modoc county combined only one may be killed and must be three points or better.

Each district requires a separate tag which must be in possession of the hunter at all times. A two-deer tag cannot be used in a one-deer district and a one-deer tag MUST be used in a one-deer district and may be used in other districts.

Non-resident California hunting licenses may be purchased at local sporting goods stores.

### Armstrong Rates Third Try 2-F—Fistic and Financial

ST. LOUIS, Sept. 15 (AP)—Henry Armstrong, the first fighter to hold three world titles simultaneously, says his comeback has to be classified as 2-F—fistic and financial.

The 32-year-old scrapper, who meets the veteran Italian fighter, Aldo Spoldi, here tonight, is making his third pugilistic climb. He's quit—for good—twice before.

He retired last year after a bout with Ray "Sugar" Robinson, but—  
"I got restless," Henry said. "I had to have something to do and I wanted to make some more money. I lost most of a quarter of a million dollars I'd made fighting in some bad investments."

And now?  
"I'm back on my feet—in nice shape," Armstrong stated. "I got some cash tucked away and some income property, too." He figures his 17 fights this year have netted him about \$30,000 out of a \$65,000 gross. This is a homecoming for Armstrong; St. Louis is his birthplace. And it will be a return engagement with Spoldi, who lasted only seven rounds with the Hammering Henry in 1942.
