HUGE SERVICE Hostage by Nazis MONTREAL, Sept. 25 (47) — Thousands of Norway's most prominent citizens are being rounded up by the German oc-cupation army and shipped to Germany as hostages, the Nor-wegian ambassador. "One such boatload," he said, "was torpedoed off the Swedish coast, and almost a 11 aboard were lost. 


