

# ARMY PLAN TO DRAIN LAKES HERE STUDIED

A proposed plan of the U. S. Army to drain and decrease the water supply in the Tulelake and Klamath Marsh and other lands north of Upper Klamath lake and west of Agency lake is now under study by the U. S. department of interior and wildlife service at the request of the Klamath county board of commerce.

Drainage of the marshes for farming lands would decrease the breeding grounds of muskrat and mink of this area. The reason, the federal fish and wildlife agency was recently advised by local officials to analyze the drainage proposal before it reaches congress.

An answering letter to the Klamath county chamber of commerce has been received from the federal wildlife service regional office in Portland, stating that a detailed survey of this area is under way and that more information in connection with the proposed drainage would be available at the end of the study.

The communication also stated that the fish and wildlife service agreed that wildlife in the Klamath area should be given every possible consideration from a standpoint of both recreational and monetary value.

## Temporary Housing Units Planned For Navy Shore Stations

WASHINGTON, Sept. 26 (AP)—Five thousand temporary dwelling units for the families of navy men returned from overseas and assigned to permanent duty at shore stations will be constructed immediately in war congested areas near naval shore stations on the Pacific coast, the national housing agency reported.

Housing will be available to both officers and enlisted men and their families. Commandants of the naval districts concerned will select the occupants.

## COMMISSION VETOS USE OF VITRIOL

A communication advising against the use of blue vitriol (copper sulphate) for algae control in Upper Klamath lake was received here this week by the chamber of commerce from the state fish and game department. Local officials recently wrote the state agency concerning the use of copper sulphate for combating the algae problem here after hearing that blue vitriol had been used successfully in other places.

In the letter, the state fish and game department stated that according to a report they had received from Oregon State college experimental station, copper sulphate would not work well in Upper Klamath lake.

The chemical, it has been found, does not work effectively in hard water, such as is found in the lake. Also, there is such a small difference between the concentration needed to kill algae and the amount that will kill fish that there would be considerable danger of destroying lake trout and other fish species, as well as the water weed.

## AGRICULTURE SHOWS SET FOR OCTOBER

PORTLAND, Ore., Sept. 26 (AP)—Dates for three agricultural exhibitions early in October—two of them open to northwest exhibitors—were announced today.

The annual 4-H fat stock show will be held at the Portland Union stockyards, October 11-13. More than 600 baby hogs, hogs and lambs have been entered, including 84 entered by Washington members.

The 35th annual Oregon Poultry and Pet Stock association show will be held at Gresham, October 6-10. The 4-H division is open to members throughout the northwest.

Oregon 4-H clubs will hold an exposition in the auditorium of Meier and Frank company, Portland, the entry list embracing gardening, home-making, forestry and similar projects.

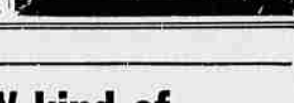
## Authorities Seek To Explain Death
