

(P)—Indefinite suspension of
Chalky Wright and his manager, Eddie Walker of New York,
in all National Boxing association states, was announced today by Abe J. Greene, NBA
president. president.

The suspension was voted by the association on the ground Wright and Walker failed to make good an agreement with the District of Columbia Boxing commission for a bout with Pittsburgh Jackie Wilson.

Wright had an agreement to box in Washington when the Willie Pep match came along," Greene said, "and on the slightest excuse of a one-night rainout, Wright took a runout, leaving promoter, commission and fans holding their heads in their hands. The suspension will remain in effect until Wright makes good to the District of Columbia Boxing commission."

Wright is scheduled to meet Pep in a bout for the New York-Pennsylvania-N ew Jersey version of the featherweight championship at Madison Square Garden Friday night, Pep took the title away from Wright in November of 1942, and since then Wright has won 22 fights, including two victories over Lui Constantino, the only fighter to take a decision from him since he lost the crown.


