

Bengals Get Nod to Take World Series

NEW YORK, Sept. 29 (AP)—Going along with the old adage that "pitching is 75 per cent of baseball"—we give you the Detroit Tigers to win the 1944 world series, provided, of course, they finish first in the most hectic race the American loop has seen in 36 years.

On the other hand, should the St. Louis Browns capture the pennant, the edge goes to the National league St. Louis Cardinals for the same reason—superior pitching—backed up by an all-around attack and a fine defense.

It's been almost a quarter of a century since two pitching mates have won 55 games in one season. As the Tigers twin aces, Hurricane Harold Newhouse and Paul (Dixie) Trout, Jim Bagby and Stan Coveleskie of the 1920 Cleveland Indians did it—and went on to defeat the Brooklyn Dodgers for the world championship.

Newhouse and Trout rate as the best two pitchers in baseball, based on this year's performance, and a seven-ace series is made to order for them. Either figures better than an even bet against a hurler Skipper Billy Southworth nominates for the Cards.

Mort Cooper, the Cards' ace and most likely series opener, should be tough to beat, despite his lack of success against the American league in previous years. However, both Ted Wilks, rookie sensation, and sophomore Southpaw Harry Breechen are strictly question marks. Both have been impressive all year.

Wilks with a 17-3 record and Breechen 18-5, but have had practically no world series experience. Breechen relieved in three games against the Yankees last fall and fared rather badly, giving up five hits in 3 and 2/3 innings and was charged with a defeat. But only time will tell whether they emulate Junior Thompson of the Cincinnati Reds, a first-year man who failed dismally against the Yankees in '39, or the Cards' Johnny Beasley, who defeated the Yankees twice in 1942.

Max Lanier, last of the Cards' big four, has returned to St. Louis for treatment of his injured shoulder. His loss would be a hard blow to the Cards' left hander, winner of 17 games this year, pitched two sterling but losing games against the Yankees last year.

The Cards have the best infield, outfield and catching, on paper, but the Tigers pack plenty of punch in Dick Wakefield, 351 and 12 homers; Rudy York, slugging first sacker who has driven in 93 runs with the aid of 17 homers, and Pinky Higgins, climaxing his gallant comeback with a .300 average.

Pete Grey Gets Chance to Play Big Time Ball

MEMPHIS, Sept. 29 (AP)—Pete Grey, phenomenal one-armed outfielder of the Memphis Chicks, will get his chance to play in the majors.

The Memphis baseball club announced today sale of the lean Pennsylvanian to the St. Louis Browns of the American league for an undisclosed amount of cash and a player.

Gray was voted the most valuable player in the Southern Association this year after leading the Chicks to the first-half championship in split-season play.

The one-armed star batted .333, socking out five home runs. He stole 68 bases to tie a modern record set by Hazen (Kiki) Cuyler.

Campaign Against Black Market For Liquor Studied
