



LONDON, Oct. 2 (P)—More than 2700 allied warplanes struck in close and deep support today of the great new American offensive against the Siegfried line in the Aachen sector of northwest Germany. Over 1000 medium and fighter Over 1000 medium and fighter bombers blazed a path into the nazi wall immediately before Li. Gen. Courtney H. Hodges' men. About 900 Flying Fortresses with 500 escoris tore at targets around Cologne and Kassell while 300 Liberators poured bomb loads into Germany's great-est freight yards at Hamm, 90 miles northeast of Aachen.
