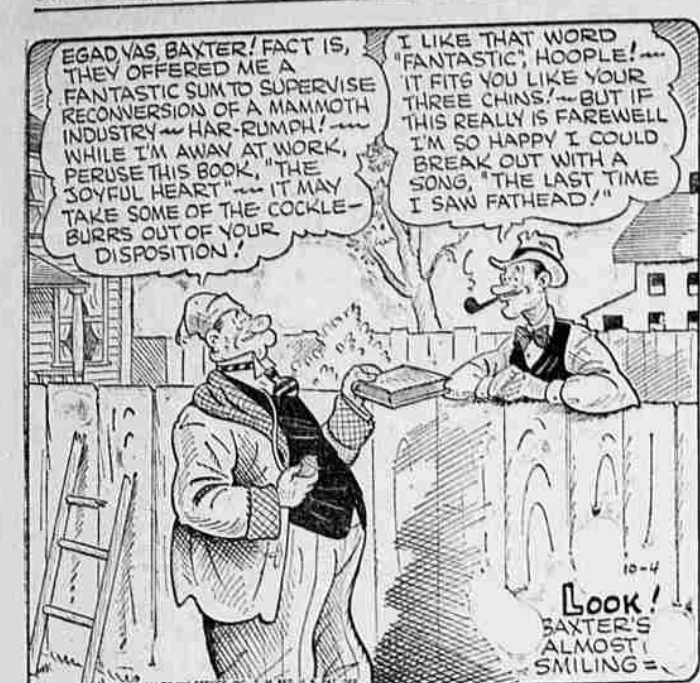

SUGAR-Ration book 4-Sugar stamps 30 through 33 valid indefinitely, 5 points each, Sugar stamp 40 valid through Feb. 28, 1945 for 3 pounds home canning only. For more canning sugar, apply local board using spare stamp 37.
