### Stream Year Here Below Normal

Statistics for the current stream year ending October 1 were released Thursday by the U. S. bureau of reclamation. Precipitation for the stream

year totaled 10.98 inches against normal precipitation of 12.97 inches. This is 1.99 inches below normal. Stream year figures of 1942-43 showed a precipitation of 18.27, or 7.29 inches higher than 1943-44. The average temperature for

1943-44 was 47.8 while the maximum was 95 degrees in September 10 and the minimum was 4 above zero on January 7 and 9. The maximum in 1942-43 was 93 degrees in August and the minimum was 1 above zero in January.
