

# Rent Stabilization Made W; Penalties Enforced

Note: This is the first in a series of eight articles prepared by the OPA rent stabilization specialist in connection with the rent control program (established here.)

Congress passed the rent stabilization act at the outbreak of war, and extended it. It was not intended to be a permanent law. It was a temporary measure to guide the nation through the rough path of a wartime economy.

The stabilization is a law, and parts of it referring to rent control are law. As law, it has penalties for those who violate it.

The credit of the vast majority of landlords throughout the country is good. The percentage of violations of OPA regulations is small in relation to the number of dwellings registered.

## Simple Straw Vote Gives FDR Lead

PORTLAND, Oct. 6 (AP)—A super-simplified straw vote—with nothing to do but yank a ticket off a board—gives President Roosevelt an almost 3 to 2 lead over Gov. Thomas E. Dewey.

The balloting, conducted in newsreel theatres in 16 cities for the past month, totaled 283,120 for Roosevelt and 188,445 for Dewey. Voters pull off a ticket from either the Roosevelt or the Dewey side of a board posted in the lobby.
