All applications must be MAILED in to the War Price and Rationing Board at 430 Main Street, and NOT presented in person.

SUGAR—Ration book 4. Sugar stamps 20 through 33 valid indefinitely. 3 points each. Sugar stamp 40 valid through Feb. 28, 1945 for 5 pounds home canning only. For all other uses apply local board using spare stamp 37.

PROCESSED FOODS—

BLUE STAMP—Ration book 4—A8 through Z8 and A5 through R5 valid indefinitely.

MEAT, BUTTER, CHEESE—

RED STAMP—Ration book 4—A8 through Z8 and A5 through K5 good for 10 points valid through October 31, 1945.

FUEL OIL—Rationing of coal, wood and stoves ends October 15. Apply local board for purchase certificates.

STOVES—Ration book 2—Appliance stamps 1-2 valid indefinitely. New stamp valid November 1. Loose stamps invalid.

WOOD, COALS, SAWDUST—Delivery by priorities based on written statements of needs.

PRICE CONTROL—Refer inquiries and complaints to price clerk at local board.

RENT CONTROL—Petitions received in all area rent offices under "peculiar circumstances" amendment.
