## Power Companies Comply With Rules On Expenditures

WASHINGTON, Oct. 12 (AP) Five electric utility companies in Oregon and Washington have "substantially complied" with the federal power commission's regulations in accounting for political expenditures during a period reviewed, the FPC announced yesterday.

The companies were the Northwestern Electric company, Pacific Power and Light company, Portland General Electric company, all of Portland, Ore., Puget Sound Power and Light company, Seattle, and Washington Water Power company, Spokane.

Examination by the FPC was asked by the Washington state grange and the Washington Public Utility Commissioners association in connection with Washington's referendum 25 which would permit public utility districts to join together to acquire private utility property, FPC said.
