WASHINGTON, Oct. 13 (P)— War Secretary Stimson said to-day there had been an "infinitesi-mal" number of reports of mili-

day there had been an "infinitesimal" number of reports of military censors inspecting servicemen's election ballots. He added that the number indicated the ballots were inspected "through accident or mistake" and "not by design."

Of more than 4,000,000 ballots sent overseas by the states, plus sthousands of federal election blanks, Stimson told a news conference only 268 reports have been received by the war and navy departments of even the outer envelope being stamped by army and navy censors. In just two instances, he said, was the inner envelope of an army ballot opened.




