Dewey, Ball Dispute Over Foreign Policy Stand of Candidate

By J. W. DAVIS Associated Press Staff Writer Governor Dewey and Senator Ball remained in sharp dispute today over the republican presidential nominee's foreign policy stand...

The Minnesota senator said in a statement issued in New York that Dewey in his Minneapolis speech last night again declined to state clearly his own position on vital questions...

But Dewey, a short time later, told a Milwaukee news conference that he thought the position he outlined "is so clear that there is no possible question of its interpretation..."

These views were expressed as the campaign roared through its busiest week yet, with each side crying "isolationist" at the other.

Four Talks Planned Time is running out, and into the next four days of a campaign that started out comparatively slowly there will be packed two more speeches by Governor Dewey and two by President Roosevelt.

Advance Line Dewey gave an advance line on his Saturday speech by saying that under republicans farm aids would be so operated as to "leave with the farmers the administration, control and operation of their program without domination or dictation from appointed bureaucrats."

Major Speeches Mr. Roosevelt's campaign blossomed into two major speeches this weekend—at Philadelphia Friday night and Chicago Saturday night, with Delaware, New Jersey and Indiana appearances in between.

The president told his news conference yesterday that some newspapers which have recalled his remark at the start of the campaign about not campaigning in the usual sense, neglected to say that he had reserved the right "to correct any misrepresentations."

A noisily enthusiastic crowd at Minneapolis last night cheered Dewey's argument that Mr. Roosevelt has demonstrated that he "cannot work with a congress of his own party," whereas "we must be able to go forward harmoniously and effectively if we are to meet the mighty problems of peace."

On the bitterly argued issue of American participation in a world peace organization, Dewey said the United States' representative must not be required "to return to congress for authority every time he has to make a decision."
