HANDICAPPED CHILD COURSE SLATED HERE

The general extension division of the Oregon state system of higher education, in collaboration with the state department of public instruction, will offer a class in "The Handicapped Child" in Klamath Falls, starting Monday evening, October 30, in the high school building.

The class in general will represent a series of presentations and discussions led by eight authorities in the respective fields to be treated. It will carry three hours of college credit for each student successfully completing the work and taking the final examination. The credit feature, however, is entirely optional with the student. Dates, topics, and instructors are:

October 30, "General Problems of the Handicapped Child," V. D. Bain, Ph. D., director of education of handicapped children, state department of education. October 31, "Problems of the Visually Handicapped," Ethel N. Fortner, M. A., supervisor of visually handicapped, state department of education. November 6 and 7, "Problems of the Hard-of-Hearing," John E. Taylor, M. A., supervisor of education of deaf and hard-of-hearing, state department of education. November 13 and 14, "Problems of the Crippled Child," Lewis D. Clark, M. D., director of crippled children's division, University of Oregon medical school.

November 20 and 21, "Psychological Behavior Problems of Children," Lewis C. Martin, Ph. D., director of child study and special education, Portland public schools. November 27 and 28, "Speech Difficulties: Articulation," Leon Lassars, Ph. D., supervisor of speech correction, state department of education. December 4 and 5, "Speech Difficulties: Stuttering and Stammering," Kenneth S. Wood, M. Ed., instructor in speech, University of Oregon. December 11 and 12, "Speech Difficulties: Physical Handicaps," Claude E. Kantner, Ph. D., speech correctionist, University of Oregon medical school.
