

# Candidates Return to Windy City for Political Speeches

 Chicago, Oct. 26 (AP)—The candidates for president, including Franklin D. Roosevelt, returned to Chicago today for a farm policy speech at Peoria, Ill., tonight, and others sharpened their word weapons.

Senator Ball (R-Minn.), who has bolted to President Roosevelt, said in a New York speech that the question of postwar peace security "is and of necessity must be a political issue." Ball is to speak on his bolt to-night at 7 p. m., PWT. (Blue network.)

Ball's cross-over has set politicians to worrying anew about what the mass of independent voters are going to do. In borderline states this is of high importance.

In Washington the state department today released a statement by Secretary Hull in which the cabinet officer described Mr. Roosevelt as "a statesman equipped by nature and experience" to meet what he termed the "gravest crisis" in human history. The statement made no direct reference to the political campaign but said that "each and every citizen at this critical time has his share of responsibility in determining which way the world is going in the years ahead."

**Enthusiastic**  
 Those politicians who say their minds are made up by will compare Mr. Roosevelt with the one Chicago speech he gave Dewey. Roosevelt and Dewey, however, are not the most and most of the governor has had his travels—and this in a house mayor is Democrat J. Kelly.

They based his attack last on the charge that Mr. Roosevelt lent his name to "sell special privileges" to the formulation of administration policies for a hundred dollars on the bar.

Mr. E. Hannegan, democratic chairman, replied in a speech at New York that he never discussed the formation of a group with the president and any quotation in the letter "stated to the president" without substance and is correct.

**No Favors**  
 Hannegan said he understood an organization has been to raise funds but denied contributors "will be recipient of special favors."

Little Rock, Democratic Directors H. L. McAlister and Sam J. Watkins took responsibility for the "club letter" and said Dewey drew a wrong interpretation.

They's audience booed his fourth term support.

Hillman, chairman of D political action committee, said at Dallas that democratic party has been over by the communists.

 John Patric, world wide traveler and author of the book, "Why Japan Was Strong," was in Klamath Falls for a brief time Wednesday.

Patric was employed by the National Geographic magazine for a number of years and during this period spent much time in Italy. He is an ardent supporter of Thomas E. Dewey for president and stated that "The present government is buying the support of various segments of the American people with the people's own money."

Patric, in referring to what he calls "the Italian new deal," stated that the government of the United States is doing exactly the same thing that was done in fascist Italy, which eventually led to government-controlled railroads and a terrific taxation measure placed upon the people as the only means of raising funds.

After his release from the Geographic, Patric decided to tour Japan, living as the Japanese lived. He prepared himself for the projected trip by living for three months in America as a poor Japanese would live.

He lived in the "land of the rising sun" for many months and gained a first hand knowledge of the Nipponese and their beliefs. He stated that the war with them could have been averted if there had been a government in Washington, D. C. that fully understood the Japanese. His book is not a war story, but an account of his hobo travels through the Japanese empire.
