American first cavalry troops, by seizing Carigara town on Carigara Bay, have eliminated the enemy's only effective point of reinforcement for the Leyte valley, which has been bottled up by the Yanks with brilliant guerrilla aid.

All organized resistance in the valley appeared to have ceased after Cavite bridge and the Dagami road junction were crushed by American tanks, artillery and bayonets.

rod of my rifle and jammed it. He swung again and got by the muzzle. There's a dent in it an eighth of an inch deep.

Here Mike usually mops his brow. He described the Jap as "ordinary size," not one of these imperial marines you hear about.

Mike's service record reads like a lot of other marines at the Klamath base. He enlisted, September 11, 1942, when he was 17.

After mopping up on Eniwetok, the outfit made an assault on Parry island, February 22, 1944.

Back to Kwajalein on February 25, and then they moved out for patrol on Ailinglap, 135 miles north of Jalut. Marines met little opposition from the Japs.

Back aboard ship, two days later, the men struck at Naru, south of Kwajalein. There was no opposition there. The marines took a Jap family, civilians, on board.

A couple of weeks later the men shoved off for Guadalcanal. Three months there and the order to leave for home.

Mike got the customary 20 days to spend with his family in New York and returned to the barracks, July 27. He likes it here. Just don't mention fencing.

Gas Coupons Taken From Valid List

Effective November 1, "E" and "R" gasoline coupons, Form OPA R-530B and R-531B, which are not serially numbered and which bear the designation "Mileage Ration" will no longer be valid for a transfer of gasoline to a consumer.

Consumers having invalidated coupons representing an unexpired ration may exchange them for valid evidences.

From November 1 on, the mileage ration record must accompany all applications for supplemental gas rations otherwise the applications will be sent back.

operations over the past two weeks preceding "the general offensive launched today" had cleared nearly 2000 square miles of North Burma and numerous communities, along with 100 miles of the Myitkya-Rangoon railroad, chief supply route in North Burma.
