Funeral services were held Thursday afternoon at Ousley chapel, with Rev. Eugene Nelson officiating. Burial was in Sunset cemetery.

Jap-Yanks Relieve 7th's Lost Battalion

SIXTH ARMY GROUP IN FRANCE, Nov. 6 (AP)—A "lost battalion" of the seventh army, which was cut off by the Germans for a week in the St. Die area, was relieved by Japanese-American troops who fought brilliantly in Italy, it was disclosed today.

The battalion was of the 141st regiment of the 36th division. The Japanese-Americans who fought their way to the trapped men late on the afternoon of October 30 were of the 442nd regiment.

"It really was ironical that we were so glad to see the Japanese," said Private Walter Yattaw, Providence, R. I., "but boy, they are real Americans."

One 48-man patrol of the battalion came back with only six men after its seven days of isolation.

Near the man's body was found a note dated August 26, informing police the man and a party of Indians had been set upon by an unidentified white man.

Administration Building Razed

PORTLAND, Ore., Nov. 6 (AP) Fire razed the two-story administration building at Henry J. Kaiser's Oregon Shipbuilding corporation today, causing loss estimated by the company at \$800,000.

Arizona. In 1906, he came here on a drainage investigation. He returned again in 1907, remaining until 1914 on operation and maintenance work. He then went to the Bell Fourche project in South Dakota as superintendent. In 1924

he went to Denver, and served five years as economist for the reclamation service. In 1929, he came back to Klamath Falls as superintendent.

The veteran reclamationist said he will continue to live in Klamath Falls. He will look after farms he owns in Arizona and South Dakota, and will do consulting work as irrigation and agricultural engineer for the bureau or private parties.

Yuma Trip Hayden will go to Yuma in November, remaining in the south until late winter, when he

will return to Klamath Falls.

He recently turned down an offer to become superintendent of operations and maintenance for the second district, which covers California and southern Oregon, and includes Central Valley and the Klamath district.

Stephens has been associated with the reclamation bureau here since 1911, except for five years from 1913-18 when he worked on other projects, including the Grand Valley and Uncompahgre in Colorado and the Flatbush project in Mon-

tana. He has been in the reclamation service for a total period of 33 years.
