Oregon Firms Now Manufacturing Goods For Civilians

PORTLAND, Nov. 6 (P)—Thirty-two Oregon manufacturing companies are now producing civilian goods.

Four more Portland firms were given the reconversion go-ahead by the WPB last week.

Paul Hirsch, deputy regional director, said the firms will turn out neon signs, farm machinery, metal safes, desk chair parts, indoor fireplace equipment and metal beds at an annual output value of \$978,000.
