The only expense to the city, he said, would concern property, and that he felt the state high way department was interested in the establishment of the proposed strip.

LONDON, Nov. 15 (P)— A force of RAF Lancasters attacked a synthetic oil plant at Dortmund in the Ruhr today in the first operation by heavy bombers from Britain since the RAF sank the German Battleship Tirpitz last Sunday morning.
