

STACY LOW BIDDER ON DRAIN PROJECT

George R. Stacy of Perker, Ariz., was low bidder on the Klamath Straits drain outlet with a bid of \$68,103.50. Bids were next to low bidder at \$78,249.50. The sealed bids were opened Wednesday at 10 a. m. in the office of the local bureau of reclamation.

The bidding is for the construction of the Klamath Straits drain outlet which comprises 500,000 cubic yards of excavation and the construction of structures pertinent to the project.

Award of the bid will be made upon approval of the Secretary of Interior in Washington D. C.

Airman Describes Jungle Adventures

PORTLAND, Nov. 15 (AP)—Capt. William J. Masters, Portland airman, described here today how he and three crewmen battled Asian jungles and torrential rains for 12 days before reaching their base, after their plane was forced down on a night over the Himalaya mountains.

Masters said they saw only two tigers, "but every morning after breaking camp we'd see fresh tiger tracks within 25 yards of our tent."

They used their parachutes for tents, beds and even socks, he recalled, and it was six days before a plane dropped them.

Native they finally met guided them back to the base.

RACE FOR SENATE POSITION TIGHTENS

PORTLAND, Nov. 15 (AP)—The race for president of the state senate is tightening up. Political observers here say that Sen. Earl Newbry, Jackson county, is seriously threatening Clackamas county's Sen. Howard Belton for the position.

Sen. Rex Ellis, Umatilla county, withdrew from the race and a number of his supporters swung over to Newbry, who has indicated his desire for the post. A third announced candidate, Sen. William E. Walsh of Coos Bay, has made no comment on the number of his pledges.

It is believed here that Belton still has the rail position, needing only a few more pledges to gain the required 18 votes.

Survey For Bubonic Plague Carriers Slated In Portland

PORTLAND, Ore., Nov. 15 (AP)—Dr. Thomas Meador, city health director, said today that a survey would be made here probably within the next few months to determine whether rats and fleas are carrying bubonic plague.

He said the action will be taken because of a Tacoma report that 10 positive cases of the disease were discovered among rats and fleas on the Tacoma waterfront.

No positive cases have been found here in previous surveys, Dr. Meador said.

Student Interchange To Create Good Will

PORTLAND, Nov. 15 (AP)—A Brazilian scientist declared today that an interchange of students by the thousands would create more real understanding between the United States and Brazil than any amount of government planning and official "good will."

Dr. Hernane Tavares told businessmen here that Latin-American countries resent being left out of postwar planning conferences among large nations. Major countries should realize, he said, that the other 30 or 40 nations of the world might have something of value to offer.

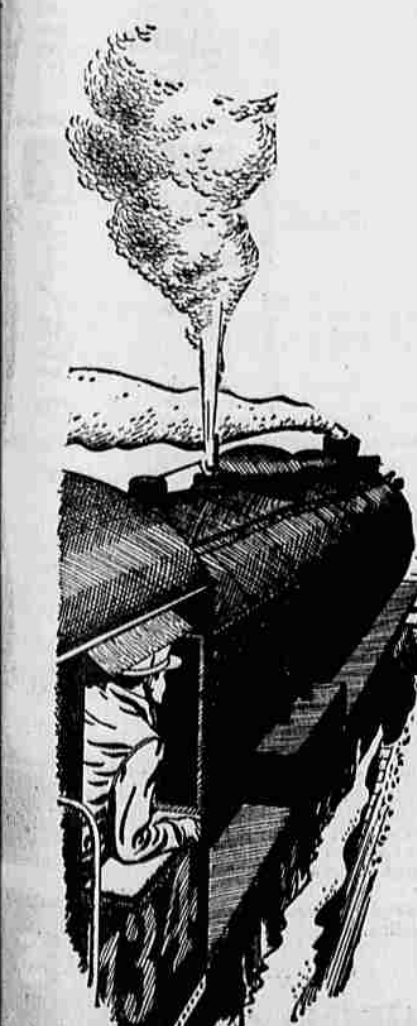

Next time you hear a Southern Pacific train whistle in the night, think of it as something more than a lonely, haunting sound. It is a reassuring sound—a promise that even while you sleep, the war trains are rolling. It's the confident voice of an industry that's doing the biggest job in its history, and will be in there pitching long after the war is over.

Wouldn't you like to know the language of the train whistles? Below we show you:

What S. P. train whistles mean



- We haven't room to explain all the whistles, but here are the commonest ones. The "o" stands for a short sound, the dash means a longer sound.
- ■ ■ ■ Warning whistle when train is approaching a highway crossing.
 - ○ ○ ○ When train is running, this means it will stop at next station, which is not a regular stop. If train is standing still, this signal warns that it is about to back up.
 - ■ ■ ■ One long whistle is sounded a mile before train reaches stations, railroad crossings, drawbridges, etc.
 - ■ ■ ■ Signal for brakeman to protect rear of train. He must go down the track with necessary flagman's signals.
 - ○ ○ ■ Signal for brakeman to protect front of train.
 - ■ ■ ■ This signal orders brakeman to return from the west.
 - ■ ■ ■ This signal recalls brakeman from the east.
 - ■ ■ This tells other trains that a second section is following.
 - ○ This is the engineer's answer to most signals from other trains.
 - ○ ○ ○ ○ A succession of short sounds is a warning to persons or livestock on the track.
