## DOE SPEAKS TO KIWANIS MEETING HERE

This country has a right to expect business statesmanship that matches its military leadership, Rilea W. Doe, vice president of Safeway Stores, Inc., told a large audience at the Thursday noon Kiwanis luncheon at the Willard hotel.

Talking on the subject, "Objectives for Citizens," Doe listed as worthy objectives the winning of the war, the exercises of better citizenship principles, and the election of strong, sound men to public office.

In emphasis of the need for real statesmanship, Doe discussed a number of national problems, including the mounting national debt. He reminded his listeners that every unnecessary debt incurred is loaded unnecessarily on the shoulders of the service men who return after fighting the nation's battles. He pointed out that pressure groups are constantly demanding things from government that mean an added debt burden.

"Remember," he said, "that somebody is always asking for these things. Let's quit holding our hands out to the government."

He also criticized the "picayunish pestering of business" by bureaucracy and the vast volume of law being written by bureaucracy "outside the constitution" through directives, orders, etc. He said there are now 3,000,000 federal employees exclusive of the army and navy, and that in California there are 239,000 federal employees compared with 30,000 state employees.

Doe urged real sacrifice on the home front and a contribution by every citizen to the welfare of his community.

He was introduced by Ted Medford, district manager of Safeway. Wives of Kiwanians were guests, as well as a number of Rotarians.

### Today On The Western Front

**U. S. 9th Army—**Secrecy which cloaked its operations for months was dropped today and it was disclosed to be operating in Holland under Lt. Gen. William H. Simpson.

**U. S. 1st Army—**Timed to coincide with an offensive by the 9th army to the north in Holland, plunged forward in the Aachen area after a tremendous aerial and artillery bombardment.

**U. S. 3rd Army—**Drew the net tighter around the fortress of Metz, guarding the Saar area, by advancing to within a mile and a half of the city.

**French 1st Army—**Plowed forward on a 25-mile front to within 11 miles of Belfort, on the extreme southern end of the front.

**British 2nd Army—**Drove to within 38 miles of Dusseldorf on the Rhine, gaining from seven to eight miles from the jump-off of its southwest Holland offensive.

**U. S. 7th Army—**Took Ste. Pole, 42 miles from Strasbourg.

**Canadian 1st Army—**Holding south of the Mass river in Holland.

TILLAMOOK, Nov. 16 (P)—David Arle Decook, 58, editor and business manager of the Tillamook Headlight-Herald who died in a Portland hospital Monday after a heart attack, will be buried here Friday.

He had been co-owner of the Headlight since 1929 to the time it merged with the Herald and continued as part-owner of the combination.

His widow, Elsie, a son, David W., three brothers and a sister survive.
