

RESPONSE TO EARLY MAIL REQUEST GOOD

I ask for the help of the press, radio, business advertisers, civic groups and all Americans in making it possible for the postal service to do its work."

Other Cities Suffer From Lack of Butter

Klamath Falls isn't the only city in the country suffering from butter shortage. A report from Dairy Products Marketing association, reveals that 32 per cent of the U. S. independent retail stores were without supplies of butter on October 17. There was no cheddar cheese in 49 per cent of the independent retailers stock in 56 cities.

The butter situation here did not look too favorable for the holidays and most stores, if they had any butter at all, were letting it go at one-half to a quarter of a pound per customer.

The Oregon delegation, leaving Portland Thursday night, will join the Washington commission at Spokane. Schaupp expects to return in mid-December.

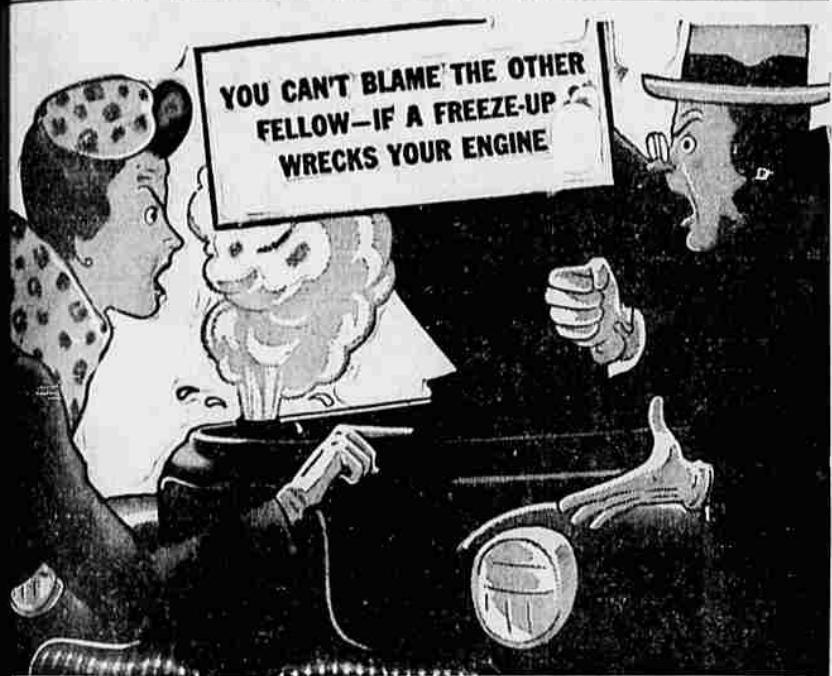
Christmas Trees Shipped to U. S.

CHIANBROOK, B. C., Nov. 22 (AP)—More than 1,056,000 Christmas trees have been shipped from central British Columbia to United States markets, particularly Texas, Louisiana, Florida and the midwest.

Most of the trees were hauled to the railroad by horse teams, although truckers were permitted to operate within a 35-mile radius.
