

HOSPITALITY ARRANGED FOR MODOC COUNCIL

Arrangements have been completed to extend warm hospitality to a score or more Modoc county residents who will come Saturday at the invitation of the Klamath chamber of commerce for a meeting of the county defense council.

The meeting will be held in conjunction with a dinner at the Willard hotel Saturday evening. The Modoc people are expected to arrive in the early afternoon and will be taken on tours of the Modoc Barracks and the Klamath group of local men will meet the visitors upon their arrival, according to Mitchell Tilson and Charles Mack, co-chairmen of the committee on arrangements. L. O. Sismore is assisting them in the entertainment program.

The county defense council meets monthly in various Modoc county towns. It is functioning as a county chamber of commerce, performing many services. A number of local men, with interests in Modoc problems, have been attending the meetings, and the invitation to meet in September by Malcolm Epley, president of the Klamath chamber of commerce.

SALEM BAN LIFTED FOR MARINE PILOTS

SALEM, Nov. 24 (AP)—Marines at the Corvallis air base will be allowed after December 1 to fly to Salem, which has been out of bounds for six weeks, Alder Tom Armstrong said today.

Armstrong said he was notified of the new order by Major Galloway, new commander of the base.

The reason for declaring the area out of bounds remains as much a mystery as ever. It was ordered by Lt. Col. Neil McIntyre, former base commander, who refused to disclose the reason, and Major Galloway denied knowledge of the reason.

Irrigation Project Contract Awarded

WASHINGTON, Nov. 24 (AP)—Interior Secretary Ickes today announced that a contract for approximately \$20,000 to further construction on the 65-mile unit main canal of the Klamath irrigation project, Oregon, has been let to the Harry I. Hamilton company, Eugene.

The canal, with capacity of 60 cubic feet per second, will divert water from the Klamath river by an existing canal near the north limits of the Bend, to irrigate 50,000 acres of dry-farm land in the Klamath water conservancy district, known as the north unit.

SECURITY BENEFIT RECOMPUTATION SET

Charles L. Maginnis, manager of the Klamath Falls office of the social security board, today explained the effect of the board's announcement that upon request it will recalculate the amount of old-age and survivors insurance benefits available to once-retired workers to include credit for wages received since the benefits were first claimed.

"This action," Maginnis said, "is intended to take into account the fact that many workers past the age of 65, who have retired and drawn benefits have gone back to work since the country started its preparation for war. Originally, these workers by filing a claim set their benefits so that they could not be moved up or down. But they returned to work unexpectedly, and generally have received higher wages than before. The board has therefore announced that, in order to meet the intent of the law, their benefits may be recomputed in order to credit towards monthly retirement benefits the wages they received after they had once filed a claim."

Approximately 500 workers in the area who are past age 65 and have received some benefits under social security have had their payments suspended and probably will benefit from the board's decision, Maginnis said.

WASHINGTON HOPES FOR HARMONY DIM

WASHINGTON, Nov. 24 (AP)—Hopes for congressional White House harmony dimmed somewhat today on the basis of two Capitol hill developments.

The powerful house ways and means committee first ignored a presidential recommendation in voting not to consider legislation to revive regulation of the bituminous coal industry.

Then the committee agreed to consider a bill to freeze social security taxes at their present levels. President Roosevelt long has favored letting the 1 per cent levies double next January 1, as provided by existing law.

Across the capitol the senate military committee decided to investigate the background of two nominations by Mr. Roosevelt to the new surplus war property board. Chairman Reynolds (D-N.C.) said the committee would look into a congressional report that criticized a government loan to a firm of which Nominee Robert A. Hurley, former democratic governor of Connecticut, was a vice president.

The other candidate for the board is Lt. Col. Edward Heller, who, Reynolds said, served under the war department official who approved the loan.
