

WASH OBJECTS TO CITY RULES ON TAXI FARE

Objections to the city regulation of taxi rates were voiced today night to councilmen by Lawrence Nash of the Victory cab company in connection with the signing of the proposed agreement between Klamath Falls and cab operators.

The agreement embodies a change in the charge for waiting from \$2 to \$5 per hour. Nash said he had no quarrel with rates in the agreement, but that he believed public utilities commission regulation would be sufficient without additional checks made by the city, and asked the reason for them.

Councilman Rollin Cantrall, who moved that the new contract be accepted and referred to the police judge to sign, answered that previous trouble involving cut-rate prices with some cab companies had led to the formulation of agreements with cab companies in regard to rates.

The new policy was to have been signed by cab operators earlier, Cantrall said, but at the meeting held for that purpose, only one owner had appeared. Nash replied that he had not been informed of the time and place of meeting, but would attend if another were planned.

Cantrall withdrew his previous motion, upon consent of the council. Walter Wiesendanger, who asked to have the old agreement remain in effect until operators had signed the new one. The matter will be brought up again next week, after a meeting with taxi operators.

Suggestions were made that proprietors of dance halls, taverns, pool rooms and hotels be

asked for contributions to allay the expense of maintaining the room in the city hall for military police and shore patrol. Councilman Cantrall said that as these groups benefitted most from the work of the officers, they should not object helping to maintain the room, which now costs the city approximately \$1000 per year for rent, heat, etc.

Mayor Houston recommended that the council meet with members of the county court some time previous to the next council meeting to discuss the matter, and suggested that members of the groups affected might sit in on the session.

Gordon Loomis, manager of the Loomis building, stated that he felt the city would be better able to cope with certain heating problems than the Klamath Heating company, urged that Klamath Falls survey the situation and find if there were any possibility of the city taking over.

Main problems of the present owners, he asserted, were black snow, lack of fuel, and the fact that insulation on underground pipes was rotting away, leaving pipes laying on bare ground and consequently losing heat.

Mayor John Houston declared that as long as he is mayor, he would fight the city's acquisition of the heating plant. He cited no reasons for his attitude, saying that they were too voluminous to mention.

Passed unanimously by the council was the ordinance setting up a committee of four members for the Klamath Memorial park. The ordinance, passed at the third and final meeting, provides that at first, terms should consist of two, four, six and eight years, and later that all terms should last eight years. In this way, only one member of the committee at a time would be inexperienced in matters concerning the park.

Councilmen listened to the second reading of the ordinance changing the city's boundaries to include the area annexed by the city in the fall election. There was no discussion.

Prisoner At Large From Fort Missoula

Capture of the trio was reported by Deputy Sheriff Paul Haecker of Sandpoint, who said the men identified themselves as Nicholas P. Mitchell, Hayden W. Dower and a Mr. Rebmann.

Earlier, six others had been apprehended near Polson, Mont., after a 90-mile-per-hour automobile chase in western Montana.

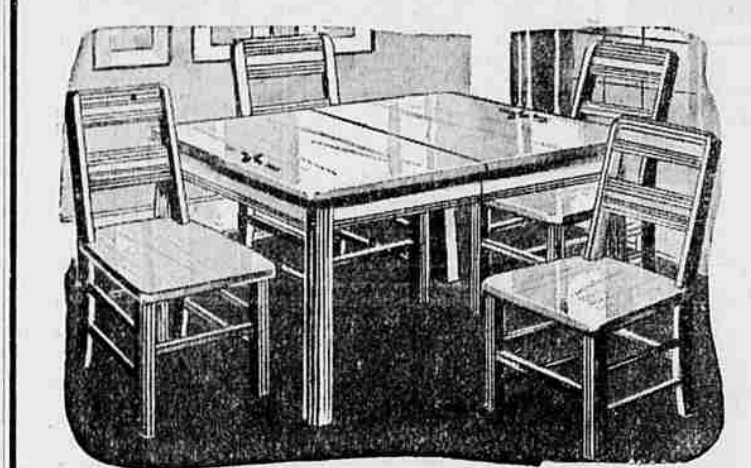

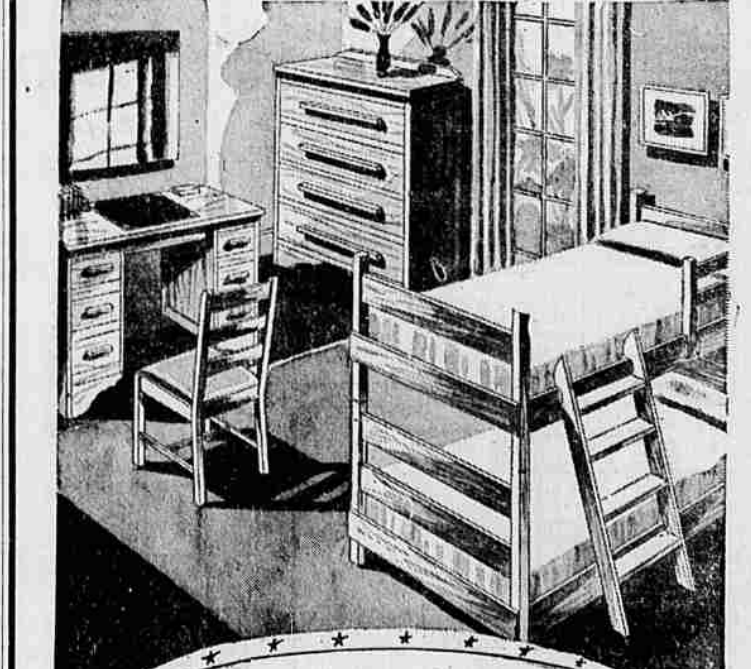
