WHEAT

CHICAGO, Dec. 1 (AP)—Reports that each rye would be delivered on December contracts prompted selling of the nearby future in the final minutes of trading today and prices broke sharply. Wheat grain was off 1/2 cent, the break and corn closed with losses ranging well above a cent a bushel.

Trade sources said the rumor of rye deliveries came at a time when there was no demand and the market was in no position to absorb the offerings. The December contract, under greatest pressure, again dropped to a discount under the May after having closed as much as 1/4 cent higher yesterday.

Wheat lost some of its gains in the late break but still was well above the previous close.

Before the final minutes of trading rye had been strong.

Corn and oats were neglected most of the session.

At the close wheat was unchanged to 1/2 cent higher than yesterday's finish, December \$1.66. Corn was off 1/2 cent, December \$1.12. Oats were 1/2 cent lower to \$1.00. Rye was unchanged to 1/2 cent higher, December \$1.13.
