

NEW LOW-COST CAR PLANNED BY FORD

NEW YORK, Dec. 7 (AP)—Henry Ford II, executive vice president of the Ford Motor company, confirmed reports today that his company will build a new model automobile after the war to be priced 15 to 20 per cent below the cost of the regular Ford.

"The kind of a car we have in mind would be a full-sized automobile with all of the built-in conveniences one gets in the regular models," he said in a statement issued at a press conference.

"There would be a certain conservation of weight and space made possible through more careful engineering and design."

The 27-year-old grandson of Henry Ford said the new automobile would embrace economies of more miles per gallon of gasoline and less upkeep cost.

He added it was not known what the postwar increased labor and materials costs would be but the company hoped to sell the new model at less than the lowest prewar automobile price of \$800, f.o.b. Detroit.

SEATTLE, Dec. 7 (AP)—Police searched today for a brutal killer who crushed the skull of a newborn boy, stabbed the body 13 times and discarded it in a trash container, where it was found yesterday in the Seattle business district.

Coroner Dr. Gale Wilson said the tiny, mutilated body was found by a woman who opened the container, then called the police.

The infant's mouth had been stuffed with paper. With the body was found a man's pipe and a toy paper horn, but the coroner said there was no clue to the child's parentage.

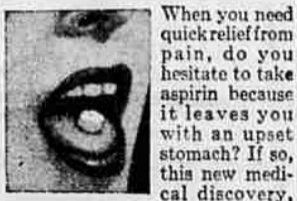
Youth Convicted On Manslaughter Charge

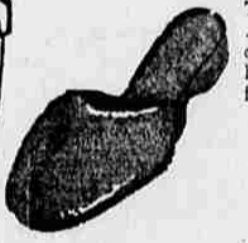

It was Nathaniel who said, "Can any good thing come out of Nazareth?" It was Judas Iscariot who betrayed the Lord for thirty pieces of silver. It was the Jewish people who said, "Away with Him! Yes, when we think of this crucifixion scene with all its injustice, hatred, and suffering, our hearts are filled with contempt and sympathy. How could human beings be so heartless and cruel and unjust? How could any man be so low and depraved as to betray his own Lord for thirty pieces of silver?

Far be it from any of us to have a part in the crucifixion of the Lord. Never would we be found guilty of betraying the Lord for thirty pieces of silver.

It must, however, be obvious to all thinking people that a paralysis of indifference to spiritual things has taken hold of the people of our day and age. As the preacher-poet of Birmingham, England, G. A. Studdert-Kennedy, has written:

"When Jesus came to Golgotha they hanged Him on a tree. They drove great nails through hands and feet, and made a Calvary. They crowned Him with a crown of thorns, red were His wounds and deep. For those were crude and cruel days, and human flesh was cheap.

"When Jesus came to Birmingham they simply passed Him by. They never hurt a hair of Him, they only let Him die; For men have grown more tender, and they would not give Him pain. They only just passed down the street, and left Him in the rain.

"Still Jesus cried, 'Forgive them, for they know not what they do!' And still it rained the winter rain that drenched Him through and through; The crowd went home and left the streets without a soul to see, And Jesus crouched against a wall and cried for Calvary."
