Of the 152,000 German casualties, 84,000 have been taken prisoner, the rest killed or permanently put out of action.
Some of the divisions wiped out—the 47th, 48th, 91st, 275th, and 338th—have been counted as destroyed once before in the six months since the invasion, but were reformed from reserves and sent back to action.

While the third army deepened its trans-Saar bridgeheads, the U. S. seventh army to the northeast lunged forward for a drive into Bischwiller, three miles southeast of Haguenau. Infantrymen supported by tanks made the double envelopment thrust.

To the north, rapidly-melting snow fell on the U. S. ninth army front, where only a patrol activity was reported this morning. The Germans began digging deeper behind minefields and rearranging defense forces on the eastern bank of the Roer river.


